Although train fares in the UK are expensive, if you buy tickets early enough, you can save quite a bit of money.*

*Finally, I would like to say that when you own a car, you can go where you want. If you go by train or bus, you are stuck with the route that the bus or train takes. In a car, you have much more freedom, so that is probably why people like to own their own cars in the UK. In my country, people do drive, but it's more common for people, especially in cities, to only use public transport. One of the main problems with so many people driving is traffic jams. . Whenever I drive to a different city or town, I always seem to be stuck in a traffic jam. If you go by train, then you never have to experience this.*
